Celebrate Easter! Part 1: Because the Curtain Was Torn Matthew 27:45-54

Question #1: What was the purpose of the Temple curtain?

- 1. It separated the Holy Place from the Holy of Holies in the Temple.
- 2. It demonstrated the separation between God and humanity because of God's holiness (Exodus 33:20) and our sin (Isaiah 59:2).

Question #2: What caused the curtain to be torn?

- 1. God tore the curtain at the death of His Son. Matthew 27:50-51 tells us, ⁵⁰ And when Jesus had cried out again in a loud voice, he gave up his spirit. ⁵¹ At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom.
- 2. The once-for-all sacrifice of Jesus as His blood made complete and final payment for our sins.

Hebrews 10:10-14 says, ¹⁰ ... we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. ¹¹ Day after day every priest stands and performs his religious duties; again and again he offers the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. ¹² But when this priest had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God ¹⁴ For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy.

Question #3: What difference does the torn curtain make today?

1. Through our new curtain, Jesus Christ, we can get in to God.

Hebrews 10:19-22 says, ¹⁹ Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings

2. Through Christ and the Holy Spirit, God can get out to us.
